

Instructions to Authors

1. Submission of typescripts. Two copies of each typescript should be sent to either Dr. Linda Bryder, The Queen's College, Oxford OX1 4AW or Dr. Richard Smith, All Souls College, Oxford OX1 4AL, together with the originals and two photocopies of any statistical tables, maps and diagrams. Authors proposing to use illustrative material are asked to consult with the editors before submitting it. A more detailed set of instructions for authors can be obtained from the editors. Neither the Editors (on behalf of the Society for the Social History of Medicine) nor the publisher accept responsibility for the views of authors as presented in their contribution. Authors are requested not to submit typescripts that are under consideration for publication elsewhere. The editors hope within eight weeks of receiving a manuscript to provide authors with a decision on whether it will be accepted for publication. Authors whose work is accepted will be expected to correct proofs of their own articles.

2. Preparation of manuscripts. All papers must be typed or letter-quality printed, double-spaced on A4 paper with ample margins and generally not more than 12,000 words (including footnotes) in length. Each page of the typescript should be numbered. In articles and review articles, footnotes should be numbered consecutively and placed together in double-spaced typing on a separate page or pages at the end. They will be printed at the foot of each page. Quotation marks should be single and not double unless they indicate a quotation within a quotation. The title of the article and the author's name should be provided on a separate sheet. A statement giving the author's present position and an address sufficient for him/her to be contacted by readers should be provided on a separate sheet. An abstract of the article containing a maximum of 200 words should also be supplied on a separate page.

3. References. Book titles should be italicized and publisher provided, e.g. A. G. Carmichael, *Plague and the Poor in Renaissance Florence* (Cambridge, 1986). An abbreviated form of title should be established on the second occasion of use, e.g. Carmichael, *Plague and Poor*, p. 25. If the reference is to an article in a periodical it should include (after the author's name and the title of the article) the volume, date in brackets and the page of the periodical, e.g. D. Thomson, 'The Decline of Social Welfare: Falling State Support for the Elderly since Early Victorian Times', *Ageing and Society*, 4 (1984), 451-82. Subsequent references to the article should use an abbreviated form, e.g. Thomson, 'Decline of Social Welfare', p. 463.

4. Tables and Diagrams. Tables should be comprehensible without references to the text. Each must be typed without vertical ruled lines, on a separate sheet and its approximate position in the text indicated by a marginal note. Graphs and diagrams should be on a separate sheet each bearing the author's name, short title of paper and figure number on the back and packed flat.

5. Copyright/Offprints. Acceptance of a contribution will imply assignment of copyright by the author to the Editors on behalf of the Society for the Social History of Medicine who will not, however, put any limitation on the personal freedom of the author to use material contained in the paper in other works provided acknowledgement is made to **Social History of Medicine** as the original place of publication. The publisher will supply the author with 50 offprints free of charge.

Subscriptions Volume 1 will be published in three issues in 1988. The annual subscription for members of the Society for the Social History of Medicine is £12. The annual subscription for non-society members is £35 (US\$60 in North America, £25 UK), with single issues available £13 (US\$23 in North America, £9 UK). Back issues of the *S.S.H.M. Bulletin* are also available for sale.

Prices include postage by surface mail or, for subscribers in the USA, Canada, Japan, Australia and New Zealand, by Air Speeded Post. Journals are sent to India by air-freight. Airmail rates are available on request.
